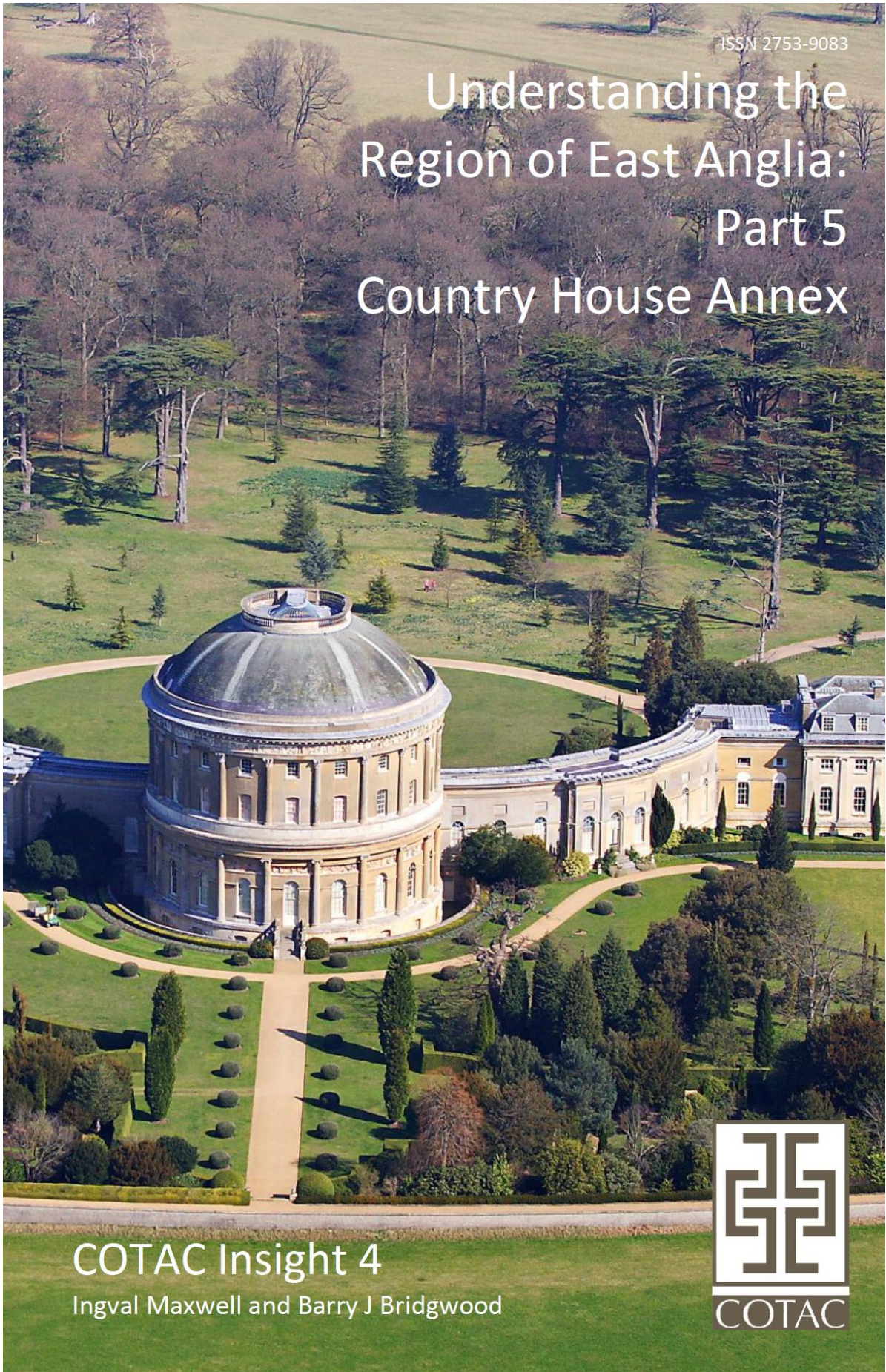

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### **Study Audience**

Insight 4 into the East Anglia Region is aimed at supporting two distinct audiences: professional and educational; and lay and learning.

Parts 1 to 4 have been prepared to enhance an Understanding of the Region within the Professional, and Education cohorts. Parts 1-4 have been devised, as far as possible, in accordance with the 14 interlinked parameters set out in Paragraph 5 of the 1993 ICOMOS Education and Training Guidelines. User are encouraged to source the considerable additional on-line materials appended as URLs in the Sourcing Additional Information end-pages attached to each Part. Should users wish to seek additional specific knowledge on various locations, Annexed Parts 5 and 6 are offered as summary information. These cover a broad url-referenced selection of listed Country Houses (Part 5) and both past and present conditions of Airfields located across the Region (Part 6). Parts 7.1 to 7.4 are offered as illustrated learning themes to further explore the Essence, Setting, Building Materials and Modern influences on the Region, each supported by an Image Set presentation. Combined, the documents aim to encourage an Appreciation by Lay and Learning audiences who may wish to know more about the Region and its detail; and by deliberating on this through their four-sets of topic-specific Questions and suggested Answers.

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### 5.0 Introduction

The listed information contained in this Part 5 aims to offer a wider appreciation and understanding of the *Country Houses and Estates from the 14th to the 19th Century* section of Part 2. The information has been briefly summarised from the Historic England Listed Building list entries for the four counties of Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex and Cambridgeshire where a full record of what has been officially recognised is available.

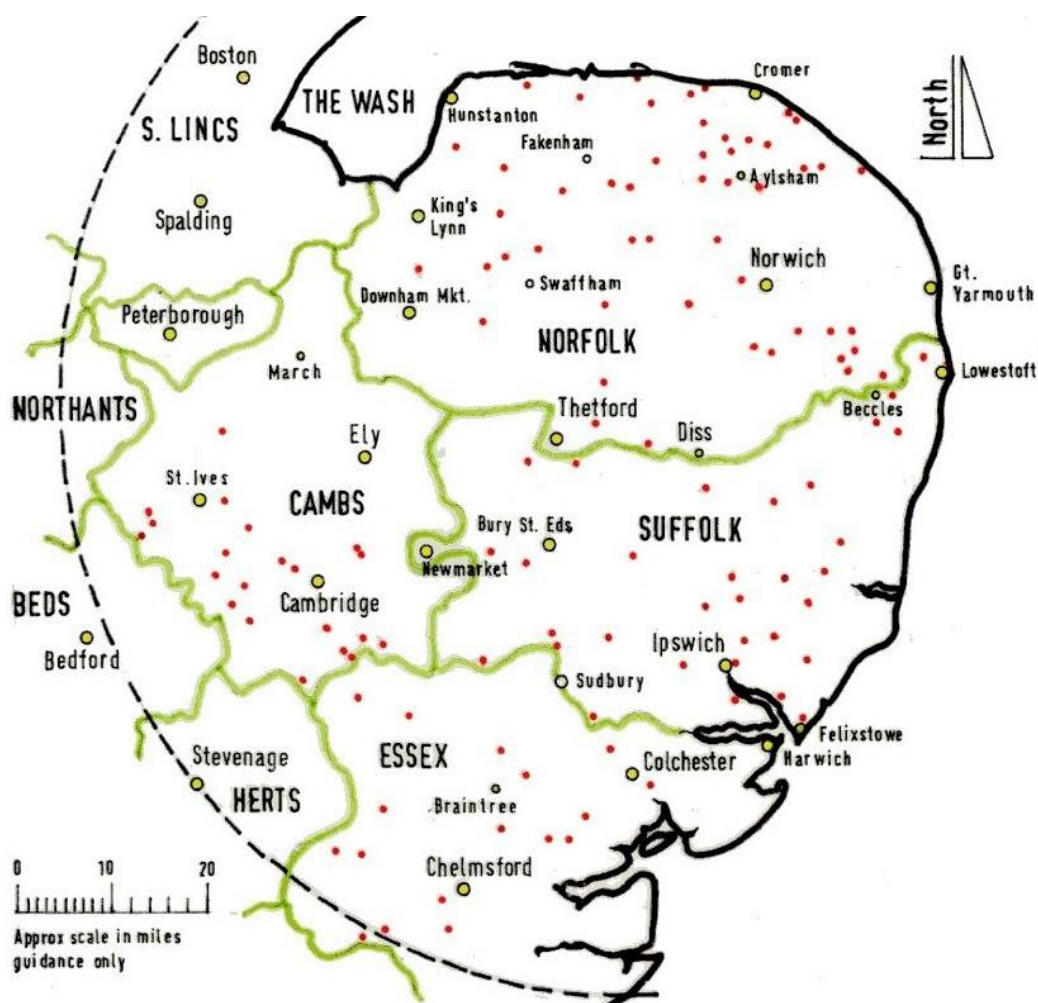
It might be recalled that each location is surrounded by varying degrees and acreages of policies and garden grounds. Collectively, these aggregate to a considerable extent of incorporated land across the Region. In addition, many estates have also originally been laid out in a manner that combined a high degree of self-sufficiency; this through associated farming, building material extraction and working and staff accommodation, along with the provision of housing, religious needs and other social requirements.

Only a selected number of Grade 1 and Grade 2\* Houses have been included in the Annex due to the large number of County House entries that exist on the formal lists (*No Grade 2 properties are included below*). The selection, however, aims to provide a representative cross section of sizes, styles, types and ages of properties across the region and the materials from which they were constructed.

## 5.1 East Anglia Country Houses: Listing Grades (as at 1 March 2020)

In East Anglia (as at March 2020) there were 60,772 Country Houses List Entries: Grade 1: 1,784; Grade 2\*: 3,668 and Grade 2: 55,320. The following selection aims to provide a representative cross section of style, type, size and age of such properties across the region.

Brick with stone dressing, castellated brick cornice, plain tile roof with crow stepped gables. Windows are mullioned, transomed and pedimented in stone. Two storeys plus two in attic accommodation.
